

# **Arrangements for giving and submitting oral presentations**

Participants giving oral presentations are requested to read the instructions and information below.

## Format and duration of presentations

Visual aids for oral presentations must be in PowerPoint format. No other visual aid equipment will be provided.

Oral presentations will be a *maximum of 20 minutes* in duration, except for:

- mini-keynote talks at the start of each Theme, which will be 30 minutes, and
- major keynote talks, which will be 40 minutes (including question time).

**NB** Speakers are encouraged to talk for less than the times specified above to allow more time for questions.

## **Question times**

With the exception of the two major keynote talks, the program has been organised to allow time for questions in a block following a group of 4-5 presentations. Such question times will be in the order of 20-25 minutes. Shorter presentations will allow more time for questions.

**NB** Speakers should note that under no circumstances will they be allowed to exceed the maximum time for presentations. Speakers will be signalled when they have 5 minutes remaining.

#### **Awards for oral presentations**

An award will be made for the best oral presentation, and the best oral presentation by a student (someone currently enrolled for a postgraduate degree).



## **Instructions for submitting your PowerPoint presentation**

You must turn in your PowerPoint presentation, on a CD, disk or stick, to the Speaker Preparation Desk 24 hours in advance of your presentation time. If you arrive later than 24 hours in advance, please take your presentation to the Speaker Prep Desk as soon as you arrive.

Label your CD, disk or stick with: (1) your name, (2) session theme, (3) your hotel room no. or contact phone number (so we can contact you if there is a problem with your file).

Name the file with your presentation as follows: (1) your name, (2) session theme, (3) the day and (4) time of your talk. Example: "A.Hines/Release strategies/Day 2/1300 hrs"

If you are presenting more than one talk, please name each file on the CD, disk or stick accordingly.

CDs, disks and sticks should be collected at the conclusion of the session in which your presentation appears, and no later than afternoon tea on Thursday 21 September.

#### Arrangements to place all oral presentations on the website

One of the main aims of the 3<sup>rd</sup> ISSESR is to make information from our discipline available widely. Please note, therefore, that unless you instruct us otherwise your PowerPoint presentation will be placed on the website (www.searanching.org) after the symposium. On the website, each PowerPoint presentation will be preceded by a note to say that the information is not to be reproduced without the permission of the author(s). We expect the website to stay active until the 4<sup>th</sup> ISSESR in 2010.
